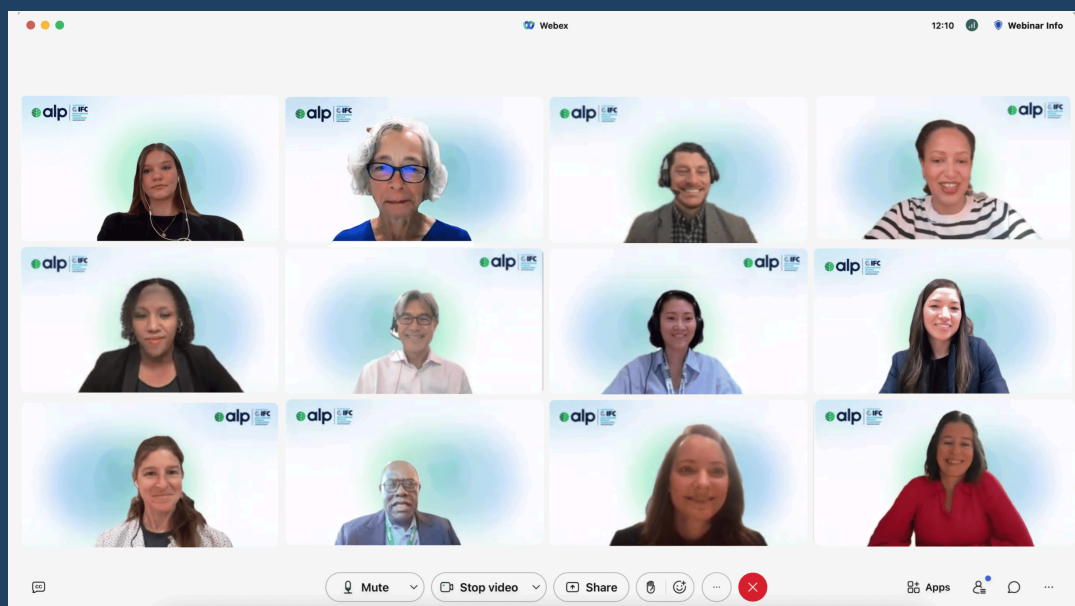




Expanding Reach, Deepening Impact

IFC and Bayer have launched a new collaboration to expand the Better Life Farming (BLF) initiative in Bangladesh, accelerating support for rural entrepreneurs and the smallholder farmers they serve. The partnership will scale BLF Centers across the country and equip more than 1,000 agri-entrepreneurs—at least 20% women-led—to deliver services that benefit an estimated 250,000 farmers.

A core pillar of the expansion is the Agribusiness Leadership Program (ALP), which will strengthen the leadership, business, and coaching skills of BLF entrepreneurs. Through ALP's practical, field-tested approach, rural leaders will learn to better manage their enterprises, build stronger market and finance linkages, and serve as trusted

advisors on resilient, climate-smart farming. This includes the use of digital tools, improved agronomic practices, and more effective engagement with farmers—key elements for boosting productivity and incomes.

Opportunities ahead include expanding mechanization, deepening commercial partnerships, and leveraging ALP to support sustained growth and rural job creation in Bangladesh. Stay tuned!



How ALP Could be a Driving Force Behind the AgriConnect Initiative

The newly-announced AgriConnect initiative by the World Bank Group sets an ambitious course: transform smallholder agriculture from fragmented subsistence systems into a major engine of jobs, growth and food security.

As AgriConnect seeks to connect fragmented supply chains and create jobs, ALP is uniquely positioned to supply the institutional-capacity building backbone needed to make this transition real. ALP has been working for nearly a decade to connect fragmented supply chains by encouraging growth and professionalization at the last mile. And ALP's framework creates a variety of off-farm jobs by helping cooperatives evolve into viable business hubs capable of generating employment and by developing the human capital and organizational discipline that would make AgriConnect interventions sustainable.

ALP also has experience reducing risk by professionalizing supply chain actors to make them more bankable. ALP trainings on training on leadership, financial literacy, and performance management would complement AgriConnect's derisking tools to ensure that capital flows into systems that are better managed and more transparent.

By scaling shamelessly, adapting creatively, and linking learning with investment, ALP can help AgriConnect connect fragmented systems, unlock private sector potential,

and create the jobs of the future across agricultural value chains.
